



Core Plus Classes (Electives):

Core Plus Option 1:

Year-long + Semester + German (Q) + Spanish (Q) **Core Plus Option 2:**

Semester + Semester + Semester + German (Q) + Spanish (Q)

Reading and writing will be integrated in each subject area. Acceleration in each of these subjects will be offered within the Cores. We do everything possible to provide students with the opportunity to take interesting, challenging and enriching Core Plus subjects. Core Plus options are subject to change as they are offered based on enrollments, facilities, scheduling, staffing and budget.

2022-23 6th Grade Core Plus Options (Electives)

Art (semester)- Provides students an opportunity to explore different art concepts such as: clay, pencils, chalks, sculpture, painting and mixed media. Art history will enhance all projects. Students will also learn how to critique works of art to be able to enjoy viewing art throughout their lives.

Beginning Band (year-long)- Students choose an instrument from the woodwind (clarinet, saxophone, flute, oboe), brass (baritone, trumpet, trombone, French horn, tuba), or percussion family (tryouts are after the first concert.) No previous music experience is necessary. Students will perform at 4 school concerts throughout the year in the evenings. Students maintain their own instruments - which may be purchased or rented from a music store. Some instruments can be provided by the school.

Beginning Orchestra (year-long w/ Music Explo)- Students learn to perform on the violin, viola, cello and string bass. A variety of musical styles from pop to classical are introduced. Students maintain their own instruments, which may be purchased or rented with the exception of the cello and string bass. These will be provided by the school for student use. No previous experience is necessary.

Choir (semester)- This performing music class is offered to students who love singing. Students will continue to develop vocal music skills and techniques necessary for individual and group musical experiences. Students will continue to develop musical literacy as well. Students will be required to participate in evening performances. The purchase of a choir uniform is required.

Computer Science (semester)- This course provides students with an introduction to computer science. Using an iterative process similar to that of engineers, software developers, writers, and artists, students will collaborate and utilize feedback to plan and develop a program. Students will also develop digital literacy skills associated with information privacy and computing technologies.

2022-23 6th Grade Core Plus Options (continued)

Creative Writing (semester)- Students are exposed to a variety of creative genres including poetry, fiction, memoirs, song writing, non-fiction essays, graphic novels, etc. Students explore their own imaginations and use the writing process to generate ideas and hone their literary skills.

German (quarter) + Spanish (quarter): These courses provide an introduction to both German and Spanish language and culture. Stresses progressive acquisition of effective community skills in both written and spoken language and an understanding of the practices of the German and Spanish cultures by utilizing games, songs, real life situational role playing and the integration of technology. **These courses will automatically be added to all 6th grade student schedules.**

Music Explo (semester)- Music Explo will explore the foundations of music including music notation, music history and composition. This class will have the opportunity to learn these skills through the playing of predominantly stringed instruments. We will learn about and analyze many different genres, forms and styles of music. If students enjoy this class, they can opt to continue on with one of our other music classes (Band, Orchestra, or Choir) if available in the second semester.

P.E. (semester OR year-long)- This course has an emphasis on participation, fitness and fun. Students will be exposed to a variety of individual and team sports. Fitness activities will focus on the components of fitness as well as the FITT principle. Students will also participate in a Heart Saver CPR class. Classroom and uniform requirements can be found on the Century website.

Tech Ed (semester)- The projects in this course utilize the MYP Design Cycle, which requires students to investigate, plan, create, and evaluate to solve problems. Students will learn applications for Microsoft Office and Google Apps, understand internet history and safety, evaluate websites, use technology in presentations, and other current technology topics.


