Starting the week after Thanksgiving: Tuesdays and Thursdays at 1:00pm-3:00pm at Legacy HS and Thornton HS and 3:00pm-5:00pm at Horizon HS and Northglenn HS.

- The Adams County Severe Weather Activation Plan (SWAP) will begin again on Oct 26. SWAP is a program that provides life-saving measures for people experiencing unsheltered homelessness. The assessment process may include referral to shelter, a hotel/motel stay, or severe weather supplies. SWAP will activate when weather conditions reach 32°F and below and wet, and 20°F below and dry. An in-person assessment is required. When SWAP is activated, people seeking services should visit the Anythink Library, 9417 Huron St. Thornton from 12:00 PM to 4:00 PM.  - To Qualify for the Emergency Housing Assistance Program (EHAP), tenants must meet these requirements:
 - Unable to pay rent or mobile home lot rent because of financial need due to COVID-19
 - Household monthly income is at or below the maximum income listed [here](#)
 - Have not already received rental assistance
 - Completed the application for assistance and provided all of the needed documentation
- EHAP can also be used for mortgage assistance for qualifying homeowners.

- ~~In partnership with Adams County and local municipalities, [Maiker Housing Partners](#) announced a new round of rental and mortgage payment assistance for Adams County residents, using funding from the GARES Act contributed by each of the partner entities. The assistance aims to prevent evictions and keep people housed during the COVID-19 pandemic. The new funding also allows a rare occurrence:~~

landlords of residential properties in Adams County may apply for rental assistance payments on behalf of tenants with unpaid rent. The application allows landlords to apply for all delinquent payments at once with no limit on the number of residents. Applications will be accepted for both residents and landlords through [the Maiker Housing Partners website](#). **Maiker has suspended applications at this time.**

New Internet Essentials customers will receive two free months of Internet service if they apply by December 31, 2020. Households with outstanding debt owed to Comcast may be eligible for Internet Essentials. Comcast is waiving this qualification for those who apply and are approved by 12/31/20. After 12/31/20, standard eligibility rules apply.

Infant and Baby Supplies

Colorado has received a delivery of infant supplies from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) that includes formula, diapers, and baby wipes. These essential supplies will go to families who are experiencing poverty and not able to find resources to meet their basic needs. The distribution of the supplies will be at 41 locations statewide at Colorado's food banks and family resource centers. These supplies will also be available to families enrolled in the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) and child care providers taking part in the Emergency Child Care Collaborative. During this challenging time, our partners at Kids First Health Care remain committed to the mission of improving the health and well-being of infants, children, and youth. To increase access to pediatric care and reduce the spread of COVID-19, Kids First has launched telehealth services for most visit types, including sick care, chronic disease management, reproductive health care, physicals and behavioral health care, and are partnering with Colorado Access to provide behavioral health services through Virtual Care Collaboration and Integration (VCCI). - **Judi's House** is a non-profit organization which provides free support to grieving children and their families. They are expanding their FREE programming for students, school staff, as well as parents/guardians as a response to COVID-19 - see below for more information. - Student Grief Educational Workshops (Grades 1st-12th):
 - To support schools in starting a dialogue with students about grief and loss, Judi's House will host live, school-based virtual workshops. Workshops will cover topics including: 1) understanding grief and its impact; 2) being supportive to those who are grieving; 3) coping with grief. Youth will have an opportunity to ask questions and know they are not alone.
- School Staff Trainings:
 - These grief-specific trainings will help school staff and personnel support the development of a grief- and trauma-aware community. These staff training can be adapted based on community needs.
- Parent/Guardian Workshops:
 - Judi's House offers live, virtual workshops for all parents/guardians who are caring for grieving children. These workshops will be limited in size to ensure participants have a chance to ask questions.

Legal

- [Colorado Legal Services](#) - Intake: 303-837-1313. Can help tenants who are facing eviction (documented only). Tenant rights and responsibilities:
 - Must have 30 days notice from the landlord and the option to pay in full within that 30 days. If the landlord won't accept payment, the tenant should attempt paying via check (not cash) and take photos of conversation in case it goes to court. If the landlord refuses payment within that 30 days the case will be dismissed.
 - Can't be evicted without court order, and the Sheriff must be present.
 - At this time, can only be removed for significant violation (more significant than nonpayment).
 - Tenants must have a way to report non-habitable issues to the landlord and must continue paying rent even if the issue is not resolved. If not resolved, can call the Health Dept in an attempt to break the lease.

Things tenants have to do to not be evicted:

- A federal "covered person": sign CDC Declaration and exhaust all available resources to not be able to be evicted before 12/31/2020. Declaration available through Maiker. Must be given to the landlord, keep copy for self, take photos as proof.
- Colorado law makes "covered person" any tenant besides someone with significant violation (weapons, drug manufacturing, violence)
- No late fees accrued between 10/15/2020 and 01/01/2021.
- Once moratorium is over, tenants must pay in full. Rent is still being accrued.

If served papers:

- Call Colorado Legal Services (number above)
- Call court to know date

- ***Mile High United Way Subsistence Line*** - Thornton Community Connections has partnered with Mile High United Way to provide emergency financial assistance to Thornton residents affected by COVID-19. Eligible residents can receive financial assistance of up to \$1,000 per month to cover essential services such as childcare, transportation, utilities, medical bills, funeral expenses, and more. If you have experienced a loss of income due to COVID-19 and your household earns less than 120% of the Area Median Income (AMI) which for a family of four is \$120,000 annually, you may be eligible. Call the Thornton Subsistence Line which is open Monday- Friday 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m. and speak to a resource specialist. 720-251-2047.  - ~~Household income has been impacted by COVID-19 on or after March 11, 2020~~
 - ~~Must reside in Adams County~~
 - ~~Household income must be below 80% AMI (area median income)~~
