





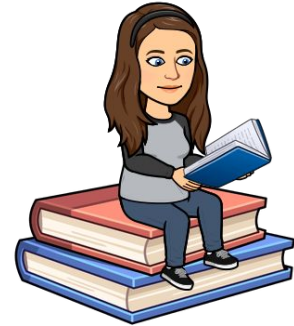

Class Description:




At the end of seventh grade students will be able to read, comprehend, and analyze a variety of both narrative and informational texts independently and proficiently. Students will be able to read like a writer and routinely produce clear and coherent text for a range of discipline-specific tasks, purposes, and audiences. They will also build their independence and be able to recognize their strengths and needed gains as they participate in feedback and reflection opportunities.

Excused Absences AND Missing Work:

Missing scores for a student who has failed to attempt an assessment will become part of the overall demonstration of knowledge that I will consider for an MYP Final Mark.

Students may turn in missing work according to school policy which is *one day for each missed day plus one additional day to gather work*. Missing work will be graded after regular work. Missing assessments that are project based are **rarely** allowed, as advanced notice is given for assignments. 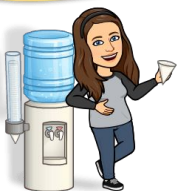

Academic Honesty:

Parents will:

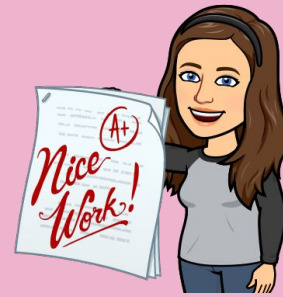
- 💕 Support students and the school in creating a community where students will independently create original work.

Grading:

This course assesses on 4 (four) criteria. The criteria are

- Criterion A—Analyzing 
- Criterion B—Organizing 
- Criterion C—Producing Text 
- Criterion D—Using Language 



Formative work plays an important role in learning in the class, and builds a foundation for our summative assessments. Formative work will be reflected in the gradebook as practice and may be graded on a 1-8 rubric or marked as missing/turned in.

Assessments and grading standards are applied consistently to students of similarly demonstrated ability. Assessments are based solely on demonstrated student progress and achievement of reasonable and clear standards. Students are encouraged to be engaged and motivated in the completion of their assignments.

The rubric achievement levels are based on a 1-8 scale, with 8 being the highest level of achievement (see the rubrics located in the student handbook for reference.) Assignments will be graded with rubrics. At the end of the semester we will issue an in-progress MYP mark as grades are trended for the year.

At the end of the year, I will issue a Final MYP Mark, which will be based on the end-of-term final grades for each of the four criteria. The Final MYP Mark will be based on a 1-7 scale, with 7 being the highest score.

Retakes for summative assessments **must** occur **within two weeks after the summative assessment is entered in IC and RETURNED to the student.** After this time period, the grade becomes final. Students are required to sign up for a retake and must come in on a mutually agreed upon time to retake the assessment. **The opportunity to re-test may be dependent on the completion of classwork and attendance at one or more study sessions.**

Communication:

Communication between parent/guardians and teachers is a vital component in your student's education. Please check with your student each day to inquire about the topics and assignments from each class.
